

Choosing a child care provider is an important job for anyone who works. But paying for that care can be a problem.

We may be able to help.

You may be able to get help paying for child care if:

- you have a child (or children) under the age of 13, and
- you are working and meet income requirements, or
- you receive TANF and are in an education, training, or other work activity approved by your caseworker, or
- you are a teen parent (under age 20) in high school, an alternative high school, or GED program, or
- you are attending education or training activities including ESL, high school equivalency, GED, vocational training and 2- and 4-year college degree programs.

There are no waiting lists. Families who fall within the income categories for their family size are eligible. For child care income levels by family size or other child care information, visit our website at www.dhs.state.il.us

All families pay a portion of the cost as a co-payment.

The amount of the family's co-payment is based on income and family size.

The DHS child care program gives working parents equal access to services to help their children prepare for school. DHS is also working to increase child care resources to help meet the needs of Illinois families who work weekends, rotating shifts, or unconventional hours.

You can choose the child care provider who best fits your individual needs.

Payments are available for full and part-time care and for before and after school while you work or attend approved school/training.

DHS will help pay for child care arrangements that help ensure the well-being and safety of your child.

Illinois law defines the following legal care arrangements:

1. Licensed Child Care Center
2. License-Exempt Child Care Center
3. Licensed Family Child Care Home
4. Licensed Group Family Child Care Home
5. License-Exempt Family Child Care Home
6. Child Care by Non-relatives — in the child's home
7. Child Care by Relatives — in the relative's or child's home

(For the child care arrangements in numbers 5, 6, & 7 above, there are limits to the number of children for which care can be provided. Check with your local CCR&R for more information.)

Qualified child care providers must pass background checks to ensure they are providing a safe environment while caring for all children. DHS will not make payments to providers for the care of their own children or to providers who have been convicted of certain crimes.

DHS funds CCR&R agencies across the state to assist you with getting a child care application, finding quality child care, and possibly helping pay for your child care. Using the list to the right, find the county in which you live and that is the CCR&R agency you should contact. Or go to our website at www.dhs.state.il.us and click on the "child care" link.
